Statement of Significance:									
The Robertsons Point Lighthouse is of State significance as an integral component of the navigational system which ensures the safe operation of Sydney Harbour. It is an important harbour navigation light which is a minor landmark on the tip of Roberstons Point. It is one of the early examples of the use of reenforced concrete in maritime situations and uses both in-situ and pre-cast sections.									
Historical Notes or Provenance:									
The Sydney Harbour Trust's annual report for the period ending 30 June 1909 stated a concrete 'light will shortly be provided on Robertson's Point, Cremorne, to facilitate the navigation of that part of the Harbour' and would be of 'similar design and material to that of Bradley's Head' (the first pre-cast reinforced concrete lighthouse in Australia). The report further noted a contract had been let for the construction of 'the Monier tower', which was 'Monier' reinforced concrete (named after its French inventor, Joseph Monier). In November 1909 it was reported the excavations were complete and work was commencing on the cement foundations of the lighthouse. The lighthouse was completed in 1910. Expenditure on the lighthouse for the period ending 30 June 1910 was reported to be £750, 13 shillings and four pence (Sydney Harbour Trust annual report, 1910).

Physical Description: An 8-metre-high circular lighthouse tower comprising three sections, a circular solid centre section of pre-cast semi-circular arches forming a tapering cylinder and a section comprising a flat circular walkway around the glazed light room, topped with a spherical copper dome with an orb shaped finial. The walkway has a light steel handrailing and a short timber foot bridge connects the lighthouse to the mainland.

The Lighthouse is supplied with mains power: Occulting green light 3 Sec, 2 on 1 off.

Physical Condition: The lighthouse is in generally good condition with no major condition issues identified upon inspection from the harbour. However, the copper dome structure appears to have a number of dents likely the result of hail damage. In addition, select areas of rust stains were identified from drainage holes below the base corbels, and sporadic areas of rust discolouration above the walkway deck.

Modification Dates:

Recommended Management: Retain in situ and conserve

Preparation of a Heritage Assessment of Port Authority of NSW Sydney Harbour Aids to Navigation in order to confirm relevance of group listing, assessed State significance and applicability of individual items.

Preparation of a Maintenance and Conservation Works Schedule to ensure acceptable condition and assist in long-term conservation.

Criteria g) The Roberstons Point Lighthouse is an integral part of the series of lights that allow Sydney Harbour to operate as a world class port. The lighthouse tower is representative of the lighthouse towers constructed at the start of the 20th century in Sydney Harbour. Collectively the lights which are detailed in the Admiralty Sailing Directions (7th edition 1999) for the information of international shipping are of State significance.

Integrity / Intactness: Integrity is linked to the 'system' of harbour lights of which it is an integral part. Further no later modifications or significant condition issues identified have substantially altered the integrity of the item and its subsequent ability to demonstrate its significance.
