## Work Afloat Protocols

This permission does not imply that any other permission, approval, or consent required by the Harbour Master, Port Authority, any other organisation, or under any local, state or federal legislation has been granted, and works are not to commence until all such permissions, approvals, or consents have been obtained.

Notwithstanding any permission, approval or rejection of an intended activity request by Port Authority, the applicant must comply with:

- all laws of the Commonwealth of Australia and the State of New South Wales, and
- any permission, approval, or consent by an authority with relevant jurisdiction over the Port, the vessel or the activity.

### Conditions

- The applicant must seek up to date vessel movements information from VTS for the duration of the activity.
- VTS must be notified prior to commencement and on completion of approved activity.
- Any marine incident or accident (including pollution & infrastructure damage) to be reported immediately to VTS.
- In instances where work will continue beyond 24 hours, daily re-approval will be required.
- Restrict public access to the berth and adjacent area during works close to the berth face when involving apparatus or watercraft.
- Activities may be required to be ceased and personnel stood down if safety of navigation is impacted, restarting only with approval from Port Authority of NSW.
- All works may be required to be ceased and personnel stood down if environmental conditions are unsuitable, restarting only with approval from Port Authority of NSW.
- Where applicable, permission from the berth owner needs to be obtained.
- Authorised User acknowledgement and acceptance - By saving and proceeding with your Intended Activity Request ("IAR"), you confirm that you have read and agree to the conditions imposed on your IAR which apply in addition to the OnePort Conditions of Use and Services. The Harbour Master and/or Port Authority of NSW may impose additional conditions on your IAR which will be notified to you. Port Authority may terminate, cancel, postpone or amend your IAR if there is a failure to comply with the conditions.
